#### INTRODUCTION

The APF Command and Staff College (APFCSC) stands as a distinguished educational institution within the Armed Police Force (APF), Nepal, providing comprehensive staff training and education to its officers. Affiliated with the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Tribhuvan University (TU) in Kathmandu, Nepal, the college aspires to evolve into a center of excellence.

The primary objective of APFCSC is to equip its selected officers with expertise in administrative, operational, staff, and policy dimensions of the organization. Upon successful completion of the course, participating officers are conferred with a Masters in Security, Development, and Peace Studies (MSDPS) in conjunction with the Professional Studies of the Command and Staff Course. The college is headed by Deputy Inspector General of APF, Nepal, who assumes the role of Commandant. Structurally, the college comprises two principal wings: The Academic Wing and the Professional Wing. The Academic Wing, overseen by the Academic Program Coordinator, assumes responsibility for the overarching academic program related to MSDPS. Eminent faculties guide student officers through this program.

The entirety of the course, inclusive of the Professional Wing, is under the purview of the Chief Instructor. Internal faculties, possessing Command and Staff Course qualifications contribute to this segment. This component is executed through a syndicate framework, facilitated by the Directing Staffs (DS). The College runs various research programs and conducts different workshops, seminars in contemporary pertinent issues.

#### PROFESSIONAL & ACADEMIC COURSE

Officers of security organization should be professionally sound, competent and capable enough to perform its mandated task in an effective manner. It is more important for the field commanders and mid-level staff officers working in Brigade Headquarters and above to enhance the professionalism and effectiveness in service delivery as well as to ensure that the organizational objectives are achieved. Organization may achieve its desired goal only when the officers working in the organization are competent enough and possess the capacity to perform the given task as expected. This can only be developed through well designed training and professional courses. Since its inception, APF, Nepal has been conducting needed professional courses as per the mandate entrusted by the Government of Nepal.

The paradigm shifts from traditional to nontraditional security threat has demanded innovative learning and techniques to address the changing security dynamics. It is right time to foster this College enhancing the overall professionalism and effectiveness of the officers working in the organization. This ultimately supports the organization to achieve excellence in the mandates as entrusted by the Government of Nepal. Officers must be able to identify the present security challenges at national, regional and global context and should also be able to extract the essence considering the political, social, cultural, religious, economic, diplomatic contexts in an informed and holistic way. Establishment of APFCSC is envisaged to meet the requirements. This course has incorporated professional as well as academic studies in contemporary pertinent issues aligning it with different research work.

#### AIM OF THE COURSE

To enhance professional knowledge and understanding of the student officers to preparing them for mid-level command and staff appointments and further experience them to assume higher command and staff responsibilities.

#### **CURRICULUM**

The Command and Staff Course Curriculum consists of:

Professional Studies: This study has been designed to enhance the professionalism of student officers where they will undergo courses on Staff Duties, Conventional Warfare, Administration and Logistic issues, Intelligence, Insurgency and Counter Insurgency, Terrorism and Counter Terrorism, Management and Planning, Disaster Risk Reduction and Management, International Humanitarian and Human Rights Law, Public Order Management, Industrial Security, Border Security and Management, VIP and Vital InstallationSecurity, UN System and Peacekeeping Operations/Missions, Financial Management, Resource Management,



PolicyPlanning Development andCurrentAffairs and other professional subjects including Internal and Foreign Study Tours.

**Academic Studies:** This studies includes wide variety of subjects and aims to facilitate the student officers broaden their understanding on Strategic Security (Global, Regional and National), Development, Peace, United Nations and Conflict Resolution. Academic Studies is conducted by the experts as per designed curriculum by TU.

**Research:** The research works are designed mainly to develop the skills of the student officers to examine the problems in detail with some recommended solution on a particular subject matter in a prescribed research format. During the course, student officers have to carry out in-depth study on the topics/subjects assigned to them for research. Each student officer tasked to prepare and submit Thesis Paper (for Master Degree). In addition, student officers have to prepare and submit term papers on specific relevant subject given to them in each term and are evaluated by a board consisting of faculty members and TU professors.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

Professional Studies is conducted by the DS in the form of a syndicate discussion. During the course, different types of exercises are conducted as a part of professional studies including Map exercises, Intelligence Preparation for Battle Field, Disaster Management, Campaign Planning, UN peacekeeping, and workshops. Each syndicate is under the guidance of the DS. English is the medium of instruction.

Academic Studies is conducted centrally in a plenary setting by professors and experts on related subject matters. Lectures, presentations, workshops, panel discussion, seminar, conference and other interactive models are used during the course.

#### **DURATION OF THE PROFESSIONAL COURSE**

The professional course at APFCSC was initially designed to last for 78 weeks until the 7th APFCSC. This course was divided into three terms, with each term covering approximately 26 weeks. However, the course underwent a revision in 2023 and as a result, its duration was reduced to 60 weeks. The reviewed course is now divided into three terms, each lasting for 20 weeks. There is six-day term break after each term. The main focus of professional studies in each term is mentioned as here under:

#### **ACADEMIC STUDIES**

MSDPS consists of academic and pragmatic courses designed to address the need of the security sector at national, regional and global level. It comprises of foundational and core courses that include security, development and peace studies.

MSDPS is spread over four semesters. That is a 63 credit hour degree program that combines both theoretical and practical knowledge and skills.

MSDPS focuses on three pillars of security, development and peace (theory building) along with some applied areas such as Industrial Security, Border Management and Security, Disaster Management and Security Laws of Nepal. However, the major concentration is on security and development.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO MSDPS**

Any candidate holding a Bachelor Degree (10+2+3 or 4) in any discipline of any University recognized by Tribhuvan University is eligible to applyfor Master in Security Development and Peace Studies course.

Candidates must be servicing Officer in APF, Nepal and should be in the rank of Inspector, Deputy Superintendent or Superintendent. Admission could also be open to the participants of othernational and international Security organizations but need to pass theentrance examination as designed by TU.

### **ADMISSION PROCEDURES**

The candidates are selected for admission through an entrance examination. They are selected on the basis of merit within the limit of total enrollment provision of the University and the College.

#### **FUTURE PLAN**

This College is planning to enroll officers of other security organizations of Nepal as well as officers of similar job nature organizations around the regionand the globe.
